The Shelton School District Board of Directors met in regular session at 6:00 p.m. on November 12, 2019 in the Mt. View Elementary Gym.

Board members present: Vice-Chairman Sally Karr, Sally Brownfield, Keri Davidson, Dan Cooling and student board representative Maria Montejo.

#### CALL TO ORDER

Vice-President Karr called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Linda Arnold led the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### ADOPTION OF AGENDA

Keri Davidson made a motion to adopt the agenda as presented. Sally Brownfield seconded the motion and the motion passed 4-0.

#### REPORTS AND RECOGNITIONS

#### 4.01 – Monthly update on bond projects:

Jeff Feeney from KMB Architects gave his monthly update on bond projects.

- We should have all punch list items complete for Shelton High School before Thanksgiving and the contractor plans on leaving the site.
- All punch list items for Mt. View Elementary are complete.
- We are still waiting for pathways for the electronic entry at CHOICE.
- We will start doing close out on the final budget numbers soon.
- The Bordeaux Gym is moving along. Foundations are going in and we expect to complete on time with no real problems.
- The Shelton High School softball field grass has been removed. We will start doing final excavation and drainage soon.
- The minidome work will be going to bid after the first of the year.

Keri Davidson commented how nice the landscaping looks in front of the Early Learning Center. She also has enjoyed seeing the drone footage of the progress on the softball field, etc.

Vice-Chairman Karr asked about the status of the vestibule at Oakland Bay Junior High. Jeff said the big work is done but the electronics are not completed as of yet and we have also been asked to do an additional piece of work installing bullet proof glass. The architect is working on how to do that right now.

# 4.02 - Presentation on School Based Health Centers:

Brianne Barrett introduced Alyssa Pyke who ESD 113 has contracted with to explore School Based Health Centers in the districts the ESD serves. ESD 113 has recently been awarded a School Based Health grant.

- School Based Health Centers (SBHCs) are clinics located in schools. SBHCs provide youth-friendly primary care and mental health services. The underlying goal is to keep students healthy so that they can focus on learning.
- SBHCs are 10-21 times more likely to serve teens than traditional mental health services.
- Regular SBHC users have reduced inappropriate ER visits, increased primary care use and decreased hospitalizations.
- A Seattle study showed students who use SBHCs for medical reasons had a significant increase in attendance when compared to non-SBHC users.
- Students who use SBHCs have better grade point averages and attendance compared to students who do not use such centers. As students' health and emotional well-being improves, so does their academic performance. At the most basic level, they also do better in school because they miss less school.

#### The SBHC model:

- Healthcare sponsor/partner leases space in schools to provide SBHC services.
- Services are offered at no out of pocket cost to students or their families.
- The care team is composed of one medical provider (ARNP or PA), one mental health therapist, and one coordinator.
- The care team partners with the school nurse, school administrators, teachers, and other key school staff to meet the identified needs of students.
- SBHC primary care services include immunizations, well child checks, sports physicals, acute care, age-appropriate reproductive health care and health education.
- SBHC mental health services include individual, group and family counseling.

Keri Davidson works in the health care field and had a number of questions and would like more information. Access to care is very important but then there is also the complexity of the health care system. Alyssa said they can bill insurance for services and the health centers she worked for worked closely with the child's health care provider. They do not want to replace primary care givers. Brianne told board members that Mason General Hospital reached out to her in July ready to offer their support.

Sally Karr asked how many of our schools the SBHCs would potentially be in. Brianne said we would probably start with one school.

Sally Brownfield said she was also very interested in this. She has spoken to families in Seattle who are talking about these health care centers. It sounds like a natural wrap around service to support the whole child. She also had questions about costs and facilities. Brianne said these would all be part of the exploration piece that we would bring back to the board in late spring.

Dr. Apostle thanked Alyssa for a great report and said he has previous experience with this program in other districts. We would probably focus on just one site for the district if the board wants to see the program happen. It would be very beneficial for our community.

#### **DISCUSSION AND ACTION ITEMS**

# 6.01 – Proposed Resolution No. 19-05:

Brenda Trogstad presented proposed Resolution No. 19-05 authorizing a levy election on February 11, 2020. The resolution was prepared by attorney Jim McNeill from Foster Garvey as per the law. The current levy expires on December 31, 2020. The three year replacement levy amount is \$5,500,000 for each collection year (2021, 2022 and 2023). The estimated levy rate is \$2.50 per \$1,000. The levy supports educational programs and operations not funded by the state such as class size reduction, after school programs, teachers, extracurricular activities, special education, facility operations/maintenance, transportation and technology.

Keri Davidson made a motion to approve Resolution No. 19-05 authorizing a levy election on February 22, 2020. Dan Cooling seconded the motion and the motion passed 4-0.

#### SUPERINTENDENTS REPORT

Dr. Apostle reported on the following:

- He recognized the school board for being designated by the Washington State School Directors Association as a School Board of Distinction for the second year in a row. They will officially be recognized on November 22, 2019 at the WSSDA Annual Conference in Bellevue.
- Last week was another monumental event in our community with the YMCA groundbreaking ceremony. Sally Brownfield made an outstanding speech at the event and Keri Davidson was also present. There were quite a few people there and was a huge event for our city.
- Last week representatives from the Alderbrook Resort delivered dozens of brand new beautiful coats for our students. We are very thankful for their generosity.
- He was involved last week with Skookum Rotary in signing dictionaries for our students. This is another great gesture by Rotary and the students are very happy to receive the dictionaries.

- He continues to discuss a site for a Trades Academy in our school district. He will keep the public and board updated on how that is going.
- We had a great Levy Committee meeting last week with about 35 people in attendance. Kristy Buck and Brad Miller are the levy co-chairs. The goal of the committee is to pass the levy at 80%.
- He and Robert Herron toured all schools except Bordeaux last week checking on the bond projects making sure we are keeping our promise to the community. He and Robert hope to tour Bordeaux this Friday.

Sally Brownfield:

- She attended the regional WSSDA meeting on October 29<sup>th</sup>. She is a member of the WSSDA Board of Directors and chaired the meeting. There were over 75 people in attendance. Sally said the meetings are always interesting because there are a few large school districts and quite a few small districts represented and it's interesting to hear about what their successes and challenges are.
- She will also be attending the WSSDA Annual Conference next week for training and networking.
- The YMCA groundbreaking was very exciting. The YMCA is already providing services and is invested in our community and in supporting families.
- Last week the Squaxin Tribe hosted a Centennial Accord meeting which is a meeting between the governor, all the tribes and the state department. She sent a report to the governor around native issues and education.
- She observed a kindergarten class at Bordeaux last week.
