








ATHLETICS

Child Find

child find activities are conducted to locate, evaluate and identify students who reside in the district and who have a suspected disability including children experiencing homelessness, regardless of the severity of the disability. If you have a child from birth through age 3, please contact South Sound Parent to Parent for an initial intake interview 340-432-7788. If you have a child age 3-5 who you suspect may have a disability, he/she may be eigible for special education services through Shelton School District If you would like more information about these programs, call 360-426-3175. If you have a student from kindergarten through age 21 who has a suspected disability, including ty, call the school psychologist at your local school for more information.

Public Records

Dursuant to RCW 42.17, parents and other members of the public have the right to inspect and copy public records retained by the District, including records pertaining to employee discipline, unless the records are exempt from public disclosure under state law.

Pursuant to RCW 42.17, parents and other members of the public have the right to inspect and copy public records retained by the District, including records pertaining to employee discipline, unless the records are exempt from public disclosure under state law. **Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)** Shelton School District may disclose appropriately designated "directory information" without written consent unless you have advised the District to the contrary in accordance with District Procedure No. 3231. The primary purpose of directory information is to allow the District to include this type of information from your child's education necords in certain school public origines, examples include: A playbill, showing student's role in a drama production; the annual yearbooks. Honor roll or other recognition infist; Graduation programs; and Sports activity sheets. Directory information, which is information this is generally not considered harmitul or an invasion of privacy if released, can also be disclosed to outside organizations without a parent's written consent. Usual organizations include, but are not limited to, companies that manufacture class rings or publich yearbooks. In addition, two federal laws require the District to provide military recruiters, upon request, with three directory information categories: names, addresses, and telephone listings unless parents have advised the District that student's information disclosed without priver written consent. If you do not want the District to stoce directory information records without prover written set, you must notify the District to alterdance; Participation in officially recognized activities and sports; Weight and height of members of athletic teams; Diplomas and awards received; the most receard previous school attended; Other information that would not generally be considered harmitul or an invasion of privacy if disclosed. It is unlawful for a person to carry onto, or to possess on, public or private elementary or secondary school premises, school provided transportation, or areas of facilities while being used exclusively by public or private schools, any firearm or any danaerous weapon (RCW 91.41, 280, RCW 69.50.435, REC 28A.210.310(2).
