SHELTON SUCCESS

We are excited to introduce the Shelton School District's next five-year strategic plan, Shelton Success.

The strategic plan is the guiding document that provides staff direction and focus to best serve our students.

There are many ways students can be supported with different types of programs and goals that we could lay out for our schools, but it's important that the district is aligned to the priorities of families, staff, students, and the community.

The planning process to develop Shelton Success began in August 2021 when Superintendent Wyeth Jessee and the School Board convened a representative steering committee to create the vision that would address the need for detailed, district-wide initiatives that significantly boost student performance, both academic and social/emotional.

Throughout the fall and winter, the Strategic Plan Steering Committee, composed of 12 community and staff members met to review past and current data and input gathered from over 1.000 Shelton School District stakeholders.

Thank you to everyone who participated in the engagement to create this plan: 570 respondents to the Strategic Plan Survey, 48 students in focus groups, 24 parents in focus groups, 30 business and community leaders in focus groups, and 462 school-based staff.

Shelton Success will guide the district's work for the next five years and includes detailed, district-wide initiatives and goals that are aimed at improving academic and social/emotional student success.
